Noted advantages of work

In the process of carrying out the research, the author showed a high degree of independence, the ability to think logically, to expose material materially and to substantiate his point of view. The strength of the work is its analytical chapters (2-5). The analysis of the geodemographic situation in St. Petersburg and Leningrad region is carried out at a good professional level. The connection of demographic processes with the development of the St. Petersburg agglomeration is shown, which allows us to evaluate the work precisely as a geographical study. The author's substantiated conclusion that the geodemographic processes in the Leningrad region depend mainly on how the development of the St. Petersburg agglomeration is developing can be considered an important result of this work. It has both theoretical and applied significance. Most of the conclusions obtained by the author are well grounded and do not raise objections.

Reported deficiencies of work

In the "Introduction" there is no separate section "Relevance of the study". One small paragraph is devoted to the topicality and it is not fully justified. The first chapter of the WRC, devoted to the theoretical and methodological foundations of the study is weak, is written formally. Little literature sources have been used, their theoretical positions are not correlated with further research. The sub-section "research methods" takes half a page and contains a minimum of useful information.

Received by the author, rather interesting results, are not compared with the published results of the work of Russian and foreign geographers and demographers.

In the list of sources there are no such documents important for the disclosure of the research topic as "The Concept of the Demographic Policy of St. Petersburg for the period until 2025" (01.07.2014), the Concept of Demographic Development of St. Petersburg for the period until 2015 (12.12.2006) and for the period until 2025 (December 22, 2015), "The Concept of the Demographic Development of the Leningrad Region for the Period Until 2025" (March 14, 2014, as amended on May 16, 2016), as well as the "Concept of the Demographic Policy of the Russian Federation for the Period to 2025".


SUPERVISOR's conclusion: If the protection is successful, the work can be evaluated as "good".
