Additional comments:

The thesis is well motivated, the author explains why joint ventures appears and how the effectiveness of this alliance can be evaluated.

The thesis is organized in three chapters. Fist chapter presents theoretical background where the author defines all the notations and considers the methodology of the research. It is important that the author made quite deep literature review and analyzed different approaches both to the alliances and stability. In the same chapter the author proposes methodology of assessment of international strategic alliances which in fact combines other methods existing in the literature that is it includes an assessment of motivational, dynamic and strategic stability. The research comprises an extensive and well-structured analysis of a large amount of related work, putting existing research into relation and into the context and research questions of the thesis.

In order to test the suggested methodology the author comprises case study research in the second chapter of the thesis which is well motivated, and the author details how this approach is adequate to address the research questions. Three cases in gas and oil industry where one can observe appearance of

alliances are analyzed. For each case, the author clearly describes the background and setting needed for the research question.

In the last chapter the author applies provided methodology of stability of international strategic alliances assessment for each case.

The thesis is well layouted and formatted. However there are some drawbacks of the thesis, namely:

- There are conclusions after each chapter missing which could ease the understanding of the impact of the author.
- Several tables are not formatted according to the Regulations.
- The list of appendixes is not included in the Table of content.

The strength of the conducted research was also confirmed by two papers published in Vestnik of St. Petersburg State University. Management Series by the author during Zhalya Mamedova's work on her thesis.

Master thesis of Zhalia Mamedova meets the requirements of the Master in International Business program, and according to the reviewer's opinion deserves an "excellent (A)" grade, thus the author can be given the desired degree.
