"Lexical means of creating a portrait of an outstanding athlete in modern sports journalism"

The final qualifying work of Yang Xiaohan, a bachelor of linguistics, is devoted to the issue of selection and semantics of lexical means, with the help of which a portrait of an outstanding athlete is created in sports publishing.

The work consists of an introduction, two chapters and a conclusion. In the introduction, Yang Xiaohan defines the relevance, goals and objectives of the study. The object of the research is the interview of the sports commentator E. Vaytsekhovskaya with outstanding athletes and coaches in the field of figure skating for the last decade. The subject of the research is the semantics of lexical units that form the portrait of an athlete.


The peer-reviewed work has been checked for plagiarism. As a result of the analysis, the share of textual coincidences (29.38%) was revealed, which include the titles of monographs, articles, the names of authors, citations from scientific papers on the topic of qualification work, as well as quotes from dictionaries that have correctly formed links to sources.

As a result of the study, Yang Xiaohan identified and described a generalized portrait of an outstanding figure skater as follows: 'a girl who is admired while performing on the ice, has a trained thin body with pumped muscles, has an unbending character, works hard and hard during training and performance time on ice'. In addition, the author demonstrated in his work the role of professionalism, vernacular, and tropes in creating a generalized portrait of a modern figure skater.

The practical significance of the work lies in the fact that the research results can be used in the practice of teaching Russian as a foreign language.

Despite the noted shortcomings, Yang Xiaohan proposed a worthy elaboration of the chosen topic. The work meets all the requirements for the final qualifying work of a bachelor of linguistics, and deserves a positive assessment.

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
