Theoretical and empirical parts are balanced and help the author to reach the goal of the research, while the discussion part could be extended and enriched by deeper discussion for demonstrating and illuminating valuable and interesting results which the author has obtained.

Quality of analytical approach and quality of offered solution to the research objectives. Adequacy of objectives coverage; ability to formulate and convey the research problem; ability to offer options for its solution; application of the latest trends in relevant research are for the set objectives.

Anastasia demonstrates himself as an independent researcher. She collected rich data through secondary sources and applied advanced analytical techniques in his work (fsQCA). The method applied by the author gives interesting and novel results for understanding not separate determinants which affect the strategic resilience of the company, but configuration of the factors.

Quality of data gathering and description. Quality of selecting research tools and methods; data validity adequacy; adequacy of used data for chosen research tools and methods; completeness and relevance of the list of references.

The author learned about the method fsQCA herself and applied it accurately. All the data collected by the author is relevant and sufficient for quantitative-qualitative methods of research and developing all necessary recommendations.
